PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

COMMITTEE BUSINESS

- Lighting

- The Committee reviewed a revised draft Local Law prepared based on comments received at the January 22 Ordinance Committee. Date of revision January 29, 2020.
- O The Ordinance Committee agreed to the changes and with no further revisions approved the draft to be referred to the ECB, PB, ZBA, and OCPB for their next possible meeting. Based on a review of the meeting schedules all comments should be returned by 3/18. The Ordinance Committee will review these comments at the 4/6/20 Ordinance Committee meeting.

- RLD – Pools on Lakeside

- O At the 1/22/20 meeting, the Committee discussed the regulation of pools in the rear yard of lots adjoining Canandaigua Lake. As another variance was brought before the ZBA, the ZBA requested again the Ordinance Committee look to revise existing rules so that the ZBA. The ZBA is concerned that by creating precedent they are effectively creating Town Law.
- o The Ordinance Committee agreed in principle to changes that would allow inground pools in the rear yard. Mr. Cooper to prepare a draft.
- The Committee discussed potential negative effects but concluded there would be limited impacts.
 - Size of pools constrained by lot coverage.
 - Only in-ground allowed which would be less visible.
 - Planning Board would review screening.
 - Current code prohibits draining pools to lake.
- The Ordinance Committee then reviewed their running list of items to potentially address. Two items were added to the list:

- Alcohol in Parks, requested by Councilman Simpson. This would allow guests in Town Parks to consume alcohol during special events and with appropriate permits. Currently consumption of alcohol is prohibited in Town Parks. The Ordinance Committee seemed overall agreeable to the proposal and may tackle at a later date.
- Penalties for Offenses, requested by Chris Jensen, CEO. Currently Town Code reads that violation of zoning ordinance can be punishable by prison time. However, Town actions are civil, not criminal. This must be revised, and at previous meetings Supervisor Menikotz proposed assisting with these revisions. The Committee agreed in concept and will review.
- After reviewing the list, the Committee agreed that the next action item would be the review of existing minimum parking requirements. Mr. Cooper will prepare a narrative and draft.
