# **City Parks Information**

## **City Park Hours**

(May 1 thru Oct 30)

## Carry In, Carry Out

With the exception of the City Pier, all City parks are "Carry In, Carry Out." This means that park patrons are responsible for carrying out any trash generated by their use of the park. The individual or group using the park facilities must carry any litter, trash or recyclables out of the park.

#### **Baker Park**

Baker Park consists of 23 acres of parkland and facilities on Buffalo Street. Features of the park include a jogging path, book trail, various game fields, basketball and tennis courts, playground equipment, space available to cross country ski, a covered pavilion, seasonal restrooms and parking. Reservations for the pavilion; \$40 for resident and \$80, non-resident.

## **Sonnenberg Park**

Sonnenberg Park features eight acres of parkland and facilities on Howell Street/Charlotte Street. The facilities include eight pickleball courts\*, two basketball courts, one softball field, a large athletic field, playground equipment, picnic area, barbecue grills, volleyball court, enclosed pavilion, and seasonal restrooms. \*Pickleball times- 8 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Reservations for the pavilion; \$40 for resident and \$80, non-resident.

## Telyea Park

Telyea Park offers one acre of parkland and yearround play equipment set in and away from the traffic on Telyea Street.



## **Jefferson Park**

Jefferson Memorial Park is situated on Jefferson Avenue and includes eight acres of parkland and facilities. Features of the park include an enclosed pavilion with a multi-purpose room (renovation starts May 2025), a lighted game field, play equipment, a skatepark, seasonal restrooms and parking. Reservations for the pavilion; \$40 for resident and \$80, non-resident.

## **Northeast Park**

Northeast Park, located on Chapel Street (near East St), has three soccer/lacrosse fields, along with a practice field and restrooms, used by the school district and local sports leagues. Reservations for the park can be secured by calling (585) 396-5080.









## **City Pier**

The City Pier, located off Lake Shore Drive, provides seasonal restrooms and a beautiful setting for fishing or relaxing on the north end of Canandaigua Lake.

## **Lagoon Park**

Lagoon Park, a forever-wild park, is located between Lakeshore Drive and Routes 5 & 20. Park patrons enjoy hiking, biking and fishing. No dogs are allowed in the park.





## **Commons Park**

This park, on the southwest side of Main Street, includes a stage, paved brick courtyard, water feature and granite benches. To reserve the

use of the stage, call the downtown Business Improvement District at (585) 396-0300.







## **Canine Campus**

Canandaigua Canine Campus is a membership off-leash dog park located on Buffalo Street – registration is required to access the park with proof of licensing and rabies vaccination. This two-acre park is a safe and friendly fenced space for healthy socialized dogs over 6 months old and their owners to gather. Features include a secure access gate, separate fenced play yards for large and small dogs, water stations, benches, and a pet memorial rock garden. The cost of \$30 for City and Town residents, or \$40 for non-residents is for the calendar year and is not prorated. Discounts for resident seniors and military. Visit City Hall to obtain your key card and collar tag.



# Kershaw Park and Public Swimming Beach

Kershaw Park features 14 acres of parkland on the north shore of Canandaigua Lake. The Park includes sidewalks along Lakeshore Drive, a dog beach, lakefront walkways, a beach area, bathhouse, a small craft launch area and public dock. Picnic pavilions, grills, and an open-air gazebo are available.

The full enclosed, guarded, beach area accessed via the Kershaw Park Bathhouse opens Saturday, May 24<sup>th</sup> (Memorial Day weekend) through Labor Day. Hours in May and June are 11:00 AM to 7:00 PM, and July- 10 AM to 9 PM.\* For the 2025 Season, there will be **FREE** admission

to the beach area for all residents and visitors. \*times subject to change based on weather, water safety changes, etc.



## **Mobi-Chair Rental**

Leave your license at the Kershaw Bathhouse and you can rent our Mobi-Chair Floating Beach Chair. This chair features rubber pneumatic tires that are easy to push across gravel or sand and a lightweight frame and buoyant tires and arm rest that allow for use in the water.

#### **Gazebo Reservations**

Need a picture-perfect setting for your wedding or wedding photos? Having a group snapshot, prom picture or gathering? The cost for the exclusive use of the Gazebo is \$75 per hour for non-residents with a maximum of \$600 for the day. Residents pay \$50 per hour with a maximum of \$450 for the day. Reservations available on line or by calling (585) 396-5060.

## **Pavilion/Park Reservations**

Reservations for Kershaw Park picnic pavilions are available for \$40 per day for city residents and \$80 per day for non-residents. Baker, Jefferson and Sonnenberg offer sheltered pavilions and may be reserved by any organized group or individual for a fee of \$80 for non-residents and a \$40 fee for residents, a deposit fee is required.

## **Dogs**

All dogs must be licensed with the municipality that they are living. You can get your dog license at the Clerk's Office in City Hall.

Dogs are allowed in the following City Parks: Baker, Jefferson, Kershaw, Sonnenberg, and Telyea, provided they are leashed and not running freely. The Canine Campus is located on Buffalo street. It is a



membership only park and the only place dogs are able to run freely. The City ordinance holding dog owners responsible for cleaning up after their dog is also in effect in all City parks. Fines can be issued for not properly disposing of dog waste. Dogs are not allowed in the bathhouse or beach area at Kershaw or at the forever-wild Lagoon Park.

## **Urban Forestry Program**

The Parks and Recreation
Department is responsible for maintenance of over 5,000 public trees in our parks and between the sidewalk and the curb or in the City's right




of way. Our urban forestry program includes tree removal, trimming and planting. The City is also a designate Tree City USA due to our commitment to our urban canopy. If you notice a problem with a tree in the city's rights of way, feel free to call Park Supervisor, Kiley Smith, at (585) 396-5060.

#### **Park Rules**

- No Alcoholic Beverages: No consumption or possession of any alcoholic beverages is permitted within any City park.
- No Tobacco: All City parks are tobacco free.
   Smoking cigarettes, cigars, pipes, or use any other form of tobacco in any City park is prohibited
- No Glass Bottles: No glass beverage containers are permitted in any City park.
- O Trash Removal: With the exception of City Pier, all City parks are "Carry In, Carry Out." This means that park patrons are responsible for carrying out any trash generated by their use of the park. Any litter, trash or recyclable must be carried out of the park by the individual or group using the park facilities. Trash can are not provided.
- O Dogs: Dogs are allowed in the City's parks except Lagoon Park, provided they are leashed and not running freely. The City ordinance making dog owners responsible for cleaning up after their dogs is also in effect in all City parks. Dogs are not allowed in the bathhouse or beach area at Kershaw. Pets are prohibited in Lagoon Park.
- Public Gatherings: Any group of 25 or more persons using park facilities must obtain a permit at least 7 days in advance.
- No Camping or Fires: No camping is permitted in any City park, and no fires are permitted except in picnic grills or other designated areas.
- Fish and Wildlife: Fishing is allowed from Kershaw Park, Lakefront Park, the City Pier and Lagoon Park in designated areas. It is prohibited to feed water fowl in any City Park. \*\*Other Rules may be posted in each park.




