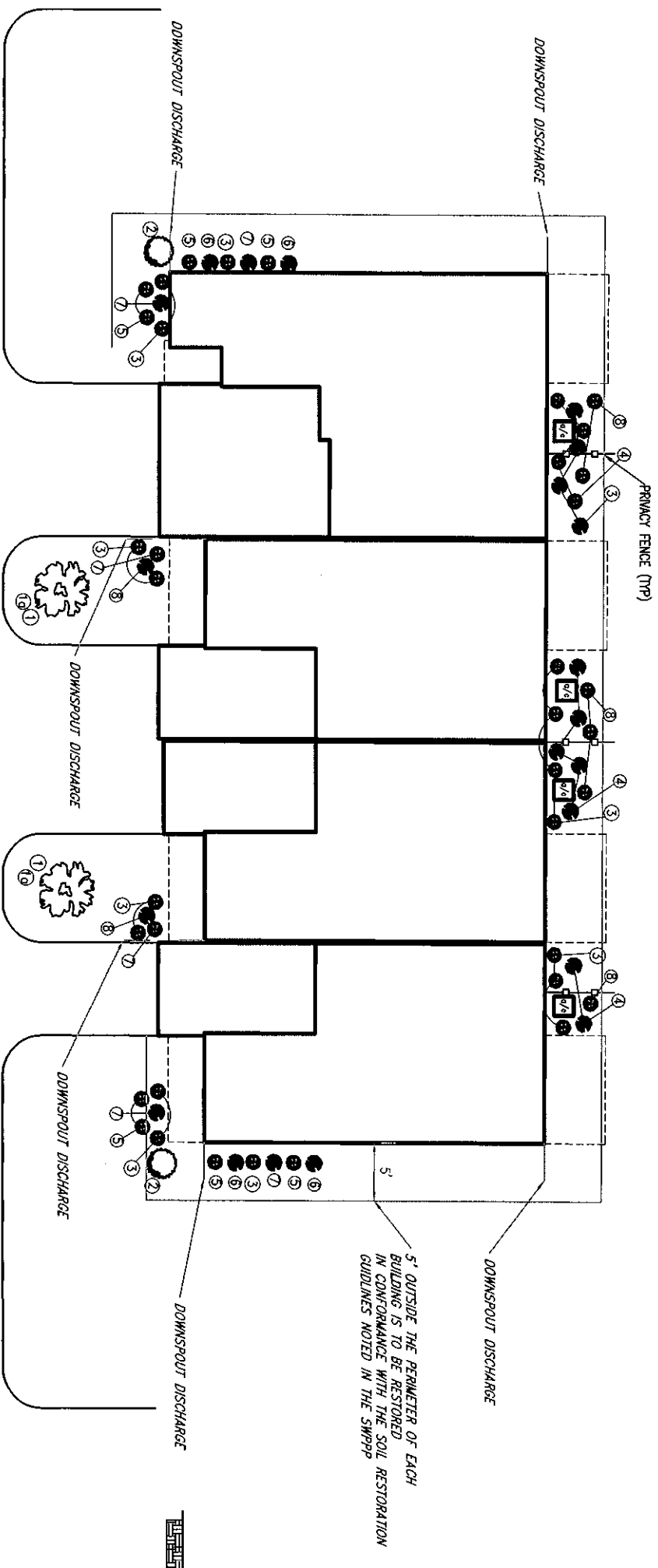

Prunus serrulata* SPEC.*Japanese Flowering Cherry, Oriental Cherry**

This species, or at least its cultivars, epitomizes to most gardeners all that is sacred about cherries. In its finest forms, the habit is vase-shaped to rounded. Newly emerging leaves vary from fresh spring-green to bronze-green. The lustrous dark green, 2- to 5-in.-long summer leaves turn bronze to subdued red in fall. Fruit are seldom produced. *Prunus serrulata* is used for every imaginable landscape situation, from a single lawn specimen to a street tree to formal allée plantings. Many cultivars are short lived (10 to 15 years); in recent years, 'Kwanzan' has suffered more than most. Viruses lead to gradual decline and, eventually, death. Species grows 50 to 75 ft. high, but the cultivars range from 20 to 35 ft. high. Zones 5 to 8. Japan, Korea, China.

Cultivars and Varieties. 'Amanogawa' develops an upright-columnar habit and produces single to semi-double, pink flowers. Grows 20 ft. high, 4 to 5 ft. wide.

'Kwanzan' ('Sekiyama'), with deep pink, double flowers, is the most common representative of the species.

'Mt. Fuji' ('Shirotae') is rich pink in bud, opening white. New leaves are pale green with a bronze tint. The growth habit is broad-spreading, rather flat-topped. Grows 15 to 20 ft. high and wide.

'Shirofugen' is pink in bud, opening to white, and fading again to pink, with 30 petals per flower. New leaves are deep bronze. A vigorous grower that develops a wide-spreading, flat-topped crown. Grows 25 to 30 ft. high, 20 to 25 ft. wide.

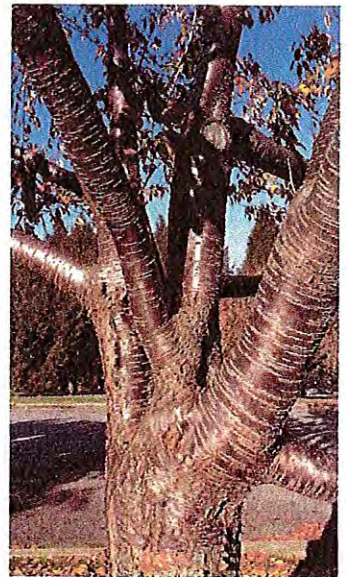

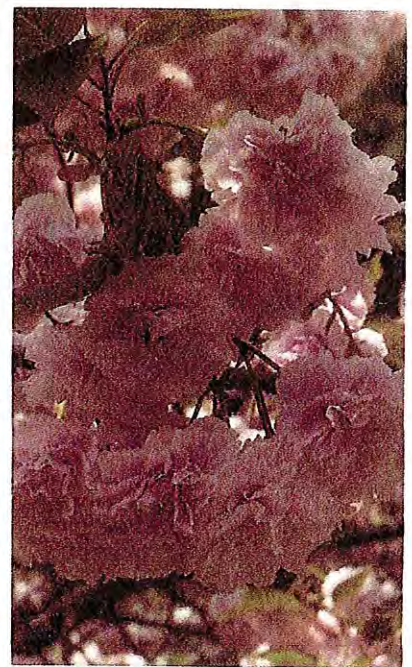

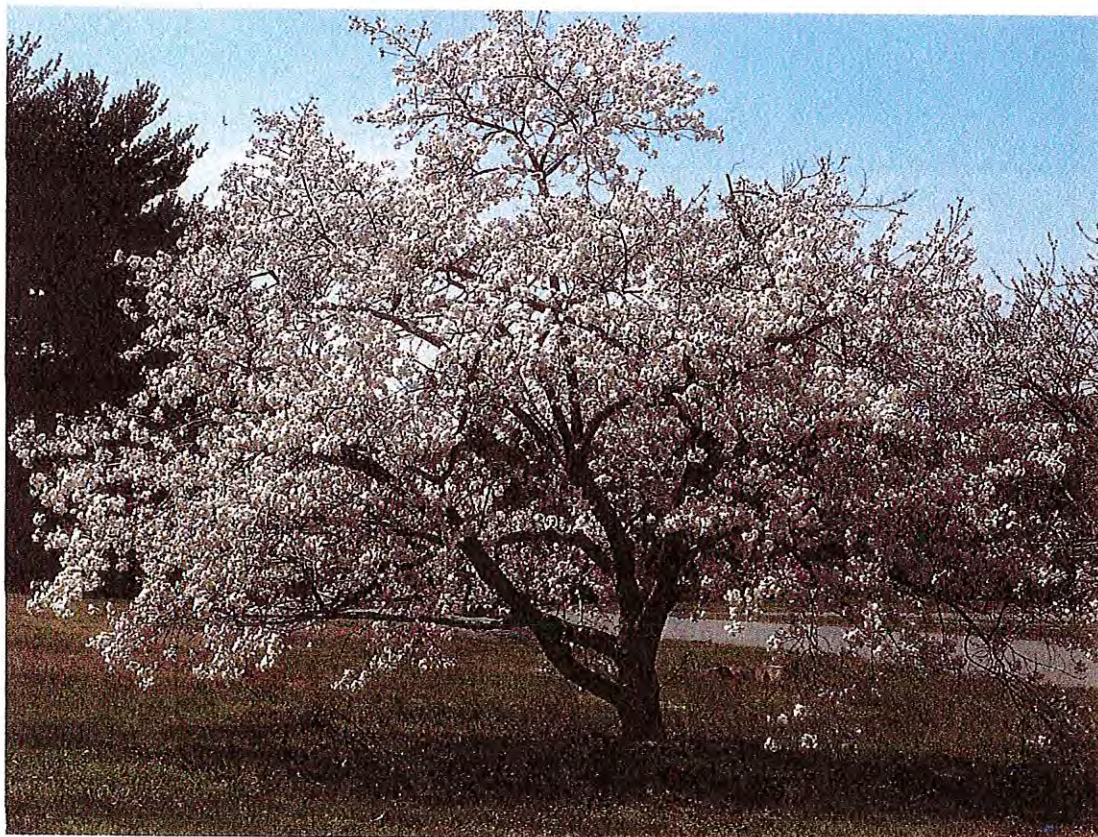

Prunus 'Hally Jolivette'

Some specimens of this hybrid cultivar form a treelike habit, but most are densely branched shrubs, often wider than they are tall. The small leaves are glossy green and may develop yellow-bronze fall color. The double, 1¼-in.-diameter flowers are pink in bud, opening to pinkish white, and are effective over a 10- to 20-day period in April and May. Fine-textured stems add to the beauty of the plant throughout the seasons. Quite fast growing and adaptable. Grows 15 to 20 ft. high and wide. Zones 5 to 7.

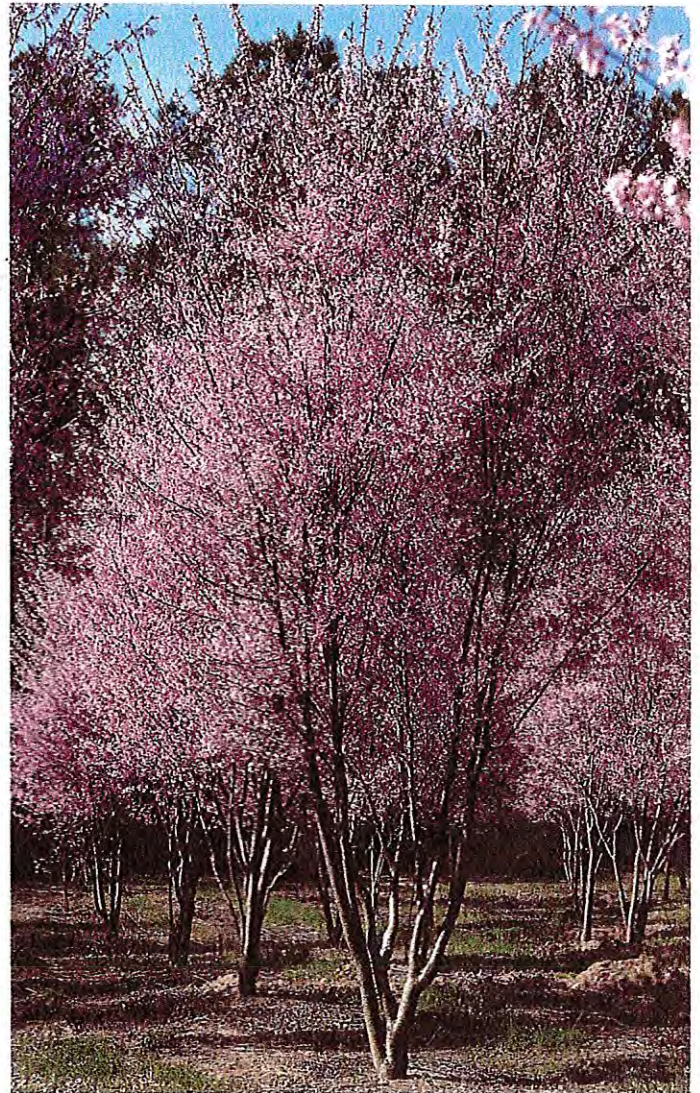

Okame Cherry

In recent years, this upright-arching flowering cherry has received greater garden press than any other cherry. In youth the outline is distinctly upright and vase-shaped, becoming more rounded with age. The polished, reddish brown bark is covered with horizontal lenticels. Rich pink flowers appear before the leaves in March and April. The 1- to 2½-in.-long, dark green leaves turn bronzy red in autumn. It has demonstrated excellent heat and cold tolerance. In the years ahead, Okame Cherry is likely to become one of the most popular garden cherries. It makes a handsome specimen tree or can be used in groupings of three to five. Hybridized by Collingwood Ingram of England, using *Prunus incisa* and *P. campanulata*. Grows 20 to 30 ft. high. Zones 5 to 8.

Prunus triloba* var. *multiplex**Flowering Almond, Double Flowering Plum**

For rich pink flower effect in April, this is a most magnificent choice. The 1- to 1½-in.-diameter, double flowers clothe the naked branches in rich rose-pink. The 1- to 2½-in.-long, medium green leaves turn yellow to bronze in fall. An adaptable shrub, but it requires full sun for best flowering. Looks a bit bedraggled in the winter months. Use in a border or mass. Grows 12 to 15 ft. high and wide. Zones 3 to 6.

Prunus virginiana**Common Chokecherry**

This suckering small tree or large shrub is similar to *Prunus padus* in most respects, and the two species are quite difficult to accurately separate. The fruit of Common Chokecherry is used for making jams, jellies, pies, sauces, and wines. Suited only to the colder areas of North America. Tolerates high pH and clay soils. Grows 20 to 35 ft. high, 18 to 25 ft. wide. Zones 2 to 5. Canada, northern United States.

Cultivars and Varieties. 'Schubert' ('Canada Red') is a selection with reddish purple foliage. New growth emerges green. It reproduces true to type from seed. Suitable only for northern climates.

Clethra alnifolia

Summersweet Clethra

During July and August, the sweet floral fragrance of summersweet can permeate an entire garden. The habit is densely rounded and often suckering, resulting in large colonies. The 1½- to 4-in.-long, sharply serrated, lustrous dark green leaves turn pale yellow to rich golden yellow in fall. Fragrant, white flowers occur in 2- to 6-in.-long, ¾-in.-wide racemes and are effective for four to six weeks. Provide acid, moist, well-drained soils, in full sun to relatively heavy shade. It has proven more heat and drought tolerant than *Clethra acuminata*. An amazingly adaptable plant. Great choice in a shrub border, along streams and ponds, or in large masses by the edge of woodlands. Grows 3 to 8 ft. high, high, variable spread. Zones 4 to 9. Maine to Florida.

Cultivars and Varieties. Several compact forms, including 'Compacta' and 'Hummingbird', are available. They grow 2½ to 3½ ft. high. 'Hummingbird' forms large colonies, whereas 'Compacta' is more shrubby.

'Pink Spires' and 'Rosea' offer pink buds and pink (or light pink) flowers as fragrant as those of the white form. Habit is like that of the species.

'Ruby Spice' is a new (1995) introduction with deep rose-colored, non-fading, fragrant flowers. Grows 6 to 8 ft. high. An outstanding selection.
