Policy AR-5: Applications involving one single family residential site, including home occupations.

The intent of this policy is to:

- Address residential development that may infringe on County ROW's or easements for roads and other infrastructure.
- Address traffic safety along intermunicipal corridors by encouraging proper placement of residential driveways along County roads.
- Address impacts to ground and surface waters

C - All other applications subject to policy AR-5.

Final Classification: Class 1

Findings:

- 1. As of 2005 69% of the parcels in Ontario County were classified as one or two family residential. Between 2000 and 2005, 2,018 residential parcels were added to the County's tax rolls (Ontario Co. RPTS Annual Report)
- 2. Collectively individual residential developments have significant impacts on surface and ground water
- 3. Proper storm water and erosion control is also needed to achieve that same end.
- 4. These issues can be addressed by consulting appropriate agencies during local review and ensuring that those standards are met.
- 5. The applicant and referring agency are strongly encouraged to involve Ontario County Soil and Water Conservation District as early in the review process as possible to ensure proper design and placement of on-site septic.
- 6. The applicant and referring agency are strongly encouraged to involve Canandaigua Lake Watershed Manager as early in the review process as possible to ensure proper design and implementation of storm water and erosion control measures.

Final Recommendation -The CPB will make no formal recommendation to deny or approve.

Comments:

- The site location map does not include the lakefront portion of the property.
- The applicant and referring agency are strongly encouraged to involve Soil and Water Conservation District as early in the review process as possible to ensure proper design and placement of on site septic.
- The applicant and referring agency are strongly encouraged to involve Canandaigua Lake Watershed Council as early in the review process as possible to ensure proper design and implementation of storm water and erosion control measures.

Kevin Olvany: No comments.

George Barden Comments: George has met with Scott Harter and toured the site. The existing septic system is not able to process additional waste from the proposed addition and there is not enough room to expand as located. Relocation of the system across the road and up the hill provides additional distance for soil and vegetation to absorb nutrients before effluent reaches the lake. The new system will be sized to handle more than 1,320 gallons per day and will therefore require a SPEDES permit from DEC. Once DEC has received final plans, they will decide whether the design will be reviewed by George or the NYSDOH in Geneva.

Administrative Reviews

The Ontario County Planning Department prepares administrative reviews of referrals as authorized, in accordance with the CPB bylaws.
