Dear Mr. Jensen,

I was given your name by a colleague of mine as the person to contact about this project. If you are not the correct person, I would appreciate you sending me the name and contact information of the correct person.

It has come to our attention that there is an addition proposed for the house at 3411 W Lake Blvd, Canandaigua, NY. Aside from a recent inquiry by a neighboring property owner, NYYSDEC has not received an application or request to review this project from either the town or the property owner.

There is an active bald eagle nest on or adjacent to 3411 W Lake Blvd. Given the proximity of the proposed project to the nest, NYSDEC is very concerned that expanding the footprint of the developed area at the nest site and removing adjacent canopy trees is likely to impact the eagles nesting. As such, a NYSDEC Part 182 Therefore, the property owners need to apply for a NYSDEC Part 182 permit for this project prior to commencing construction. A federal eagle permit is also likely necessary for this project. Below is some basic information for the property owners on how to apply for a NYSDEC Part 182 permit. - 3. Proposed plans, including cross sections, with the limits of construction (i.e., a line on the plans surrounding all staging, storage, and operations areas).
- 4. Recent site photos depicting existing conditions
- 5. A full project description
- 6. An assessment of the efforts made to avoid and minimize impacts to listed species
- 7. An assessment of the extent of the impacts to listed species or their habitats
- 8. An endangered species mitigation plan that lays out how the applicant proposes to provide a net conservation benefit; and
- 9. An implementation agreement that identifies the funding available and who is responsible for implementing the proposed endangered species mitigation plan.
