In accordance with Town of Canandaigua Town Code §17-5 the Town of Canandaigua Agricultural Advisory Committee (Ag Committee) met on June 4, 2020 to review and provide comment relative to the application(s) listed below and referred to the Ag Committee by the PRC. The applications and the Ag Committee's findings are as follows.

## CPN-20-027 4047 Woolhouse Road Tax Map #s 111.00-1-31.100 and 111.00-1-29.113

Review was based on:

- Application materials on file as of 6/4/2020
- Ontario County On-Cor maps
- Maps and Parcel Ranking data in the 2016 Agricultural Enhancement Plan
- Maps and Parcel Ranking data in the 2018 Open Space, Conservation, and Scenic Views Master Plan
- Town policies and maps incorporated in Comprehensive Plan and Land Use Planning documents adopted by Town Board.

## Findings:

- 1. The applicant wishes to subdivide two existing parcels that will result in 4 total parcels.
- 2. Tax Map # 111.00-1-31.100 **IS** located within Ontario County Ag District 1 and Tax Map # 111.00-1-29.113 **IS NOT**.
- 3. Both parcels ARE currently farmed by the property owner (who is also the applicant).

- 5. 111.00-1-29.113 consists of the following soil types:
- 6. Both parcels **DID** receive a rating from Ag Enhancement Plan and the ratings were very similar for both. Received points for proximity to protected land and for the presence of natural resources. Both ranked low for development pressure.
- 7. Properties **DID** receive a rating from the Open Space Master Plan. They both ranked **very low** overall.
- 8. Property IS NOT in the Padelford Brook Greenway
- 9. Property IS in the Strategic Farmland Protection Area
- 10. Property IS in the Strategic Forest Protection Area

## **Comments:**

- 1. The committee reviewed comments from Sam Casella and Eric Cooper while evaluating the referral. It appeared that the subdivision was well thought out to utilize lower quality farmland and wooded area for house sites.
- 2. There is some concern as to whether this could impact PDR application.
