

# ACADEMY CEMETERY

## 1819 – Present

Seneca Point Road (off CR-16)  
Town of Canandaigua, New York



The Academy Cemetery lies within the historic Academy Tract, an area of about three thousand acres in the southwest corner of Canandaigua, set aside by Oliver Phelps in 1804 to be used in support of Canandaigua Academy, hence the name Academy Tract. Academy had two small population clusters, one at the intersection of Seneca Point Road and Old West Lake Road, and the second on Naples Road (now Route 21), at the Monks Road intersection, where a post office and general store served the rural residents of the south end of town, roughly midway between Canandaigua and Naples.

As appeared in an article published in the *Neapolitan Record* (Naples, NY) on June 23, 1886 about Academy Cemetery:

*“In the year 1819 a Mr. Samuel Conner lived upon the farm from which these grounds were taken. A daughter of his some 15 or 16 years of age sickened and died, and there being no burying place at hand a resort was made to a knoll upon one corner of the premises, (then a primeval forest) the brush cleared away, a grave dug, and the remains buried therein. At the end of the two years following, some five or six other graves were grouped around this one and without inscriptions with the single exception of that of a three-year-old son of Jonathan Seldon (sic). The monument to this one is in very good state of preservation, reading – Jonathan M. Seldon, etc., 1821. Burials went forward from this time for 20 years or so with little attention to system, when Judge N.W. Howell, agent for the sale of Academy lands, in deeding this farm and one adjoining made a reserve of two acres of land here for a church site and cemetery; since that time lots have been chosen by different families in the grounds still unoccupied and more attention has been given to system in their management. . . .”*

Academy Cemetery, beginning as a private burial ground, eventually passed to Town ownership. It is still an active burial site, as plots sold long ago are still called into use on occasion. Burials here include veterans of the American Revolution as well as the War of 1812, Civil War, World Wars I and II, and more recent engagements. Civil War veterans are honored with a memorial stone erected in 1923, listing several local soldiers who served in the war.

Local families who patronized Academy Cemetery came mainly from Academy, Cheshire, their rural surrounding areas and the adjacent towns of Bristol and South Bristol.

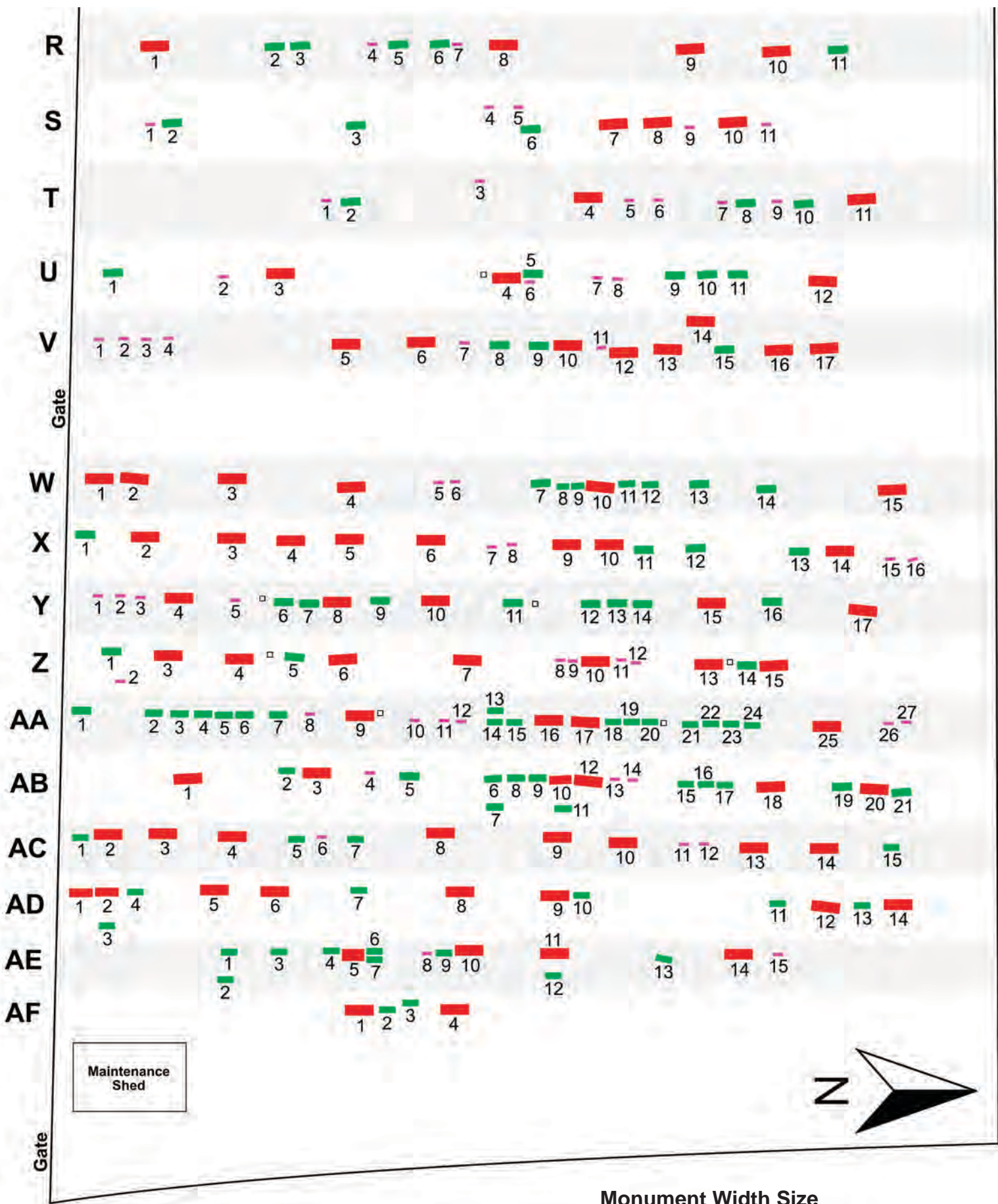

# Cemeteries in the Town of Canandaigua

**Academy Cemetery** (East side of Seneca Point Road and south of County Road 16) This cemetery was previously privately operated, but is now owned by the Town. There are graves of veterans of numerous wars. There is a large Civil War memorial stone at the entrance stating, "Erected by the citizens of Canandaigua under the leadership of Henry C. Beeman (1847-1927) Company C., 15th N.Y. Cav. 1862-1865" erected in 1923. The Cemetery is maintained by the Town.

**Benham / Red Dock / Wolverton Cemetery** (On private property to the west of County Road 16, north side of Wyffels Road; not accessible to the public) The cemetery originally abutted the now-abandoned Wolverton Road. Graves date from 1831 to 1883, with family names including Beeman, Beidler, Burch, Dempsey, Gates and Wolverton. First mention is in a deed of 1882, Parshall to Parshall. Grantors had obtained the title from the State of Connecticut in 1812.

**Cooley Cemetery** (Northeast side of Cooley Road, near intersection of Short Road) First reference to this plot is in 1879. "Twenty-four rods of land set apart by Lyman Cooley in his lifetime as a family burying ground." It is the smallest of the Town's cemeteries holding just 6 burials. Stones include Shaw 1828, and Sheldon 1816. The Cemetery is maintained by the Town.

**Hunn Cemetery** (Corner of Woolhouse Road and County Road 32, aka Bristol Road) Consisting of one acre, it is one of the oldest Town cemeteries. Also called Van Norman Cemetery and Sutherland Cemetery in past years. First described as a "public burial ground" in a deed dated February 4, 1815 (Liber 23 of Deeds, Page 84) from Joseph Van Norman to his son Isaac Van Norman. There are many families buried here, including Briggs, Case, Hawley, Hickcox, Mack, Nethaway and Tillotson. The most recent burial was in 1931 of Martha Spears. The oldest is Seth Holcomb on September 28, 1799. Deeds from 1833 refer to a small piece of land, on the lot opposite the burying ground, on which a meetinghouse was erected and used for public worship. This was not mentioned in the 1875 transfer and there is no evidence of the house today. Zadok Hunn, a professor at Yale and, through his ministry, organizer of nine Congregational churches in the area, is buried in the Cemetery along with many from his family. There are also at least 13 Revolutionary War veterans and one War of 1812 veteran buried here. The Cemetery is maintained by the Town.

**Lucas Cemetery** (East side of Route 21, south of Lucas Road) Zebina Lucas was one of the earliest owners of record. His grave, along with a number of his family members, are among the 64 burials in this Cemetery. Recorded burial dates range from 1826 to 1910. The Cemetery is maintained by the Town.

**New Michigan / Tilton Cemetery** (East side of New Michigan Road, north of Yerkes Road) Located in the northwest corner of the Town. This plot is fenced in. It was never a public cemetery. There are numerous stones dating from the middle of the 19th century, including Samuel Tilton 1859. The most recent is 1891. The Cemetery is maintained by the Town.

**Pine Bank Cemetery** (North and south sides of Wells-Curtice Road at Cheshire) This Cemetery is the Town's largest, and is privately owned and operated. It has recorded veterans of many wars including the Revolutionary War, War of 1812, Mexican War, Civil War, World Wars I and II, Korean War and the Vietnam War. In addition to the 34 known Civil War veterans actually buried here, another 10 Cheshire natives who lost their lives in the Civil War, but with unknown burial locations, have been remembered on a memorial stone.

**Root / Remington Cemetery** (Public cemetery without road frontage, not accessible to the public, northwest of the intersection of Nott and Middle Cheshire Roads) Created by Roswell Root in 1802. This is the burial site for 6 Revolutionary War veterans, 6 War of 1812 veterans (4 of whom also served in the Revolutionary War) and 2 Mexican War veterans. The 86 burials range from 1802 to 1896. The Cemetery is maintained by the Town.

**Sand Hill Cemetery** (South side of Emerson Road, near Sand Hill Road) Owned by the Sand Hill Cemetery Association of Canandaigua. The one-half acre burying ground contains 187 burials, mostly dating between 1820 and 1900, with some 20th and 21st century additions. Original deed transfer is Joseph Phelps to Samuel Knapp in 1812. Many burials are from the local Cassort, Knapp, Padelford, Pike and Tiffany families. At least 3 are Revolutionary War veterans. The Cemetery is maintained by the Town.

This cemetery inventory and brochure was developed by History Project Team members and local Town volunteers. Information provided by The Ontario County Genealogical Society and the Canandaigua Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution was consulted for additional data. This brochure documents over 480 burial markers in 32 rows, some of them representing more than one burial, for a total of over 700 recorded names, plus several other graves with illegible markers. Names in red are war veterans, with the war indicated by an initial (see Key). Additional information on each recorded burial is available at the Town's website: [townofcanandaigua.org](http://townofcanandaigua.org). This includes expanded names, birth and death dates, maiden names, and in many cases links to a [findagrave.com](http://findagrave.com) site, where obituaries, photos and other information may be found. # Town of CANANDAIGUA

Located in the Finger Lakes Region of New York State

## History of the Town of Canandaigua

Canandaigua officially became a town in 1791. Before that, this area was part of the homeland of the Seneca, the westernmost of the Six Nations that made up the Haudenosaunee, or Iroquois League. A Seneca village located west of the current City of Canandaigua was destroyed during the 1779 Sullivan Campaign, but the Senecas continued to occupy temporary and seasonal sites along the lake and throughout the town; many of our principal roads today follow the paths of Seneca trails.

The first town meeting was held in 1791, with the first Supervisor, General Israel Chapin, presiding. Settlers were principally New England farm families, attracted by the town's rich soils. Initially there was no distinction between the village and the town of Canandaigua. Then in 1815 the village was established, and in 1913 it became a city, thus creating two separate municipalities, the City and Town of Canandaigua.

Three hamlets grew up over the 19th century as small population centers within the town – Cheshire, Academy and Centerfield, each located on a main road. A fourth hamlet, Padelford Station, was established at the crossing of two rail lines in the northeast part of the town. During the steamboat era from about 1850-1925, farmers along the lake enjoyed expanded access to markets, and summer cottages and camps began to dot the lakeshore. In recent decades the Town has aimed for a balanced mix of agriculture, lake-related tourism, small business and country living.
